

Direction by the Honourable Kenneth Trevor Griffin, Attorney-General, pursuant to Section 8 (4) (b) published in The South Australian Gazette on 22 August 1996, pages 685 to 687.

WHEREAS by subparagraph (4) (b) of section 8 of the *Business Names Act 1996*, it is provided that, subject to any direction of the Minister, the Corporate Affairs Commission **must not register a business name that is the same as, or that is, in the Commission's opinion, likely to be confused with or mistaken for a registered business name; or a business name the registration of which has expired during the preceding two months; or the name of a body corporate.**

**The Commission may register a business name, that is, in the Commission's opinion, likely to be confused with or mistaken for a registered business name or the name of a body corporate where the application for registration of the business name is made by the applicant for the purpose of carrying on business in the circumstances mentioned hereunder:**
